Mongolia V.E.T.Net staff has been building relationships with the local veterinarians in Umnugobi Aimag, through our Veterinary Continuing Education Program and Ministry. As a result of this ministry several local veterinarians became Christian. Last year a local veterinarian named Tungalag found out about our Gift of Love ministry.

She asked if V.E.T. Net would help some needy people in Umnugobi Aimag.

Small animal medicine and practice is becoming popular in the rural areas of Mongolia. However, Veterinary School does not teach much about small animal medicine. Therefore, these rural veterinarians of Umnugobi Aimag were asking for some practical training from Mongolia V.E.T. Net.

In September 2020, a team of V.E.T. Net veterinarians Gantuya and Uuganzorig; teacher Pagmaa, driver Jagaa, longterm volunteer Dr. Justin Woolsey and his wife Helen and their 2 children made a trip to Umnugobi to help with these requests. The mission was accomplished in threefold as they organized a spay surgery practical session for 34 local veterinarians, distributing 64 Sheep – the gifts of love to 24 needy families and attending the Open Day Ceremony of the Umnugobi Aimag's

One such family is Batmagnai's. Batmagnai is 48 years old, is married and has 4 children. In 2009, he was involved in an altercation that resulted in the death of a person. As a result, he had to serve time in prison. Four years ago, he was involved in an accident that resulted in paralysis of the lower half of his body.

His wife, Otgonchimeg, told us that sometimes he is in so much pain that he considers suicide. However, he is not the only one suffering. She was diagnosed with uterine cancer. Despite her condition, she faithfully takes care of her husband and manages all the family affairs.

After we had given them their 4 sheep, we were able to talk with Otgonchimeg. Because of the gifts that were given, we not only were able to show the love of God to this family, but we were able to share how they could experience a new life in Christ. We are happy to say that Otgonchimeg now has a new hope for this life and eternity as well.
