Greetings of the day. May God's blessings be abundant on you, my faithful partners for the expansion of God's kingdom in my home country of Mongolia. My name is Narantungalag and I am serving as a Claim a County for Christ (CAC) Coordinator for Bayankhongor Aimag. This is my third year participating in Gift of Love distribution and ministry. I am so thankful for all these fluffy gifts that are making many people happy and enabling us to be the messengers of Jesus' love for rural needy people in Bayankhongor aimag.

I have some reasons to praise God and would like to share with you about these reasons. A year ago my fellow worker, accountant Zoljargal, Zoloo for short, asked me to help with a serious issue. Zoloo told me that there were two veterinarians in Bayankhongor Aimag, Jargalant County who were struggling to run their veterinary clinic. Their names are Nanjid and Bolormaa. These local veterinarians have been to our Veterinary Continuing Education Trainings few times in 2014-2018. They started purchasing our good quality veterinary drugs and provided veterinary services to herders in Jargalant. They were working hard to run this business with their limited knowledge and experiences of running a private veterinary clinic. Eventually, they fell into debt to V.E.T. Net. No matter how hard they tried their veterinary business was struggling to survive. Their main problem was the cash flow. Herders were poor about managing and saving their cash for veterinary drugs and services. They struggled hard. Nanjid and Bolormaa started avoiding V.E.T. Net people. Everytime I visited Jargalant, I tried to visit with them but they were unreachable. Thankfully, Gift of Love ministry made them reachable. I decided to use a different tactic this time to find these veterinarians. I went to the Head of the People's Representative Meeting – a lady named Uranchimeg. I introduced the Gift of Love project and explained that we will need the involvement of the local veterinarians in this project called Gift of Love. As I left her office I prayed and waited for God to move.

Apparently, Mrs. Uranchimeg liked the idea of multiple benefits for Jargalant people and summoned the herders the next day at the Bag herding site and told them about Gift of Love. Herders liked the idea and the veterinarians came to take part in this. Veterinarian Nanjid called me on the phone and said that she would like to join Gift of Love. Nanjid liked the win win situation which GOL provide for her and the herders who were also struggling to find cash to purchase good quality drugs for their livestock. Bolormaa liked the idea of providing sheep for needy families in Jargalant plus she could continue providing veterinary services to her herders.

Thus everybody worked together to bring the Gifts of Love to 43 people of 19 families in Jargalant County. After we gathered up the sheep and distributed to the needy families we shared with

them about God. We told them that there are these people who have received God’s love and now they want to share this love with you. These Gifts of love are provided by these beloved people.

That day I had an opportunity to share about my reason, my faith in Jesus Christ with one more lady. This is the local veterinarian Urnaa. Urnaa is a lady in her mid-fifties. She works for the rural herders at Khangai Bag herding site on the north of Jargalant County. Veterinarians Nanjid and Bolormaa encouraged her to join the GOL. Urnaa took their advice and joined us. After distributing the sheep to the needy families at Khangai Bag Urnaa got to ride with us back to the Jargalant County center.

On the road, I told Urnaa about God’s love. Urnaa listened to my words. She looked deep in thoughts while I told her about God. I invited her to the local church in Jargalant. Baavai is the church elder. She was not able to be there during our sheep distribution and Good News sharing time. She had a funeral to attend. I asked Baavai to follow-up with the Gift of love recipients, the local veterinarian Urnaa and the herders who provided sheep. I believe and hope that Baavai is doing that.

I thank you for blessing all of these dear people in Bayankhongor Aimag, Jargalant County. The three local veterinarians are out of debt, 13 herders got good quality drugs for their animals and 43 needy people have food in their bowl. Most of all

they have heard about God, they have seen His love in action. Now we are praying that their spirits would be saved eternally by God.

Sheep and Shepherd for Saraa

Among those who received these Gifts of Love there was Saraa. Saraa is 61 years old. Her husband died several years ago. A year ago Saraa fell and her hip bone was displaced. So she has had to stay in bed for a long time. The day we brought the sheep to her, Sarah got up from her bed and went outside to see the sheep. Saraa was so grateful for this Gift of love. She said, “Jesus’ Urnaa comes to me to pray when I hurt. Today I was thinking about her and you all came...” Saraa often calls this lady named Urnaa, the local church leader. Then I told her about the God’s love and the Good News message to Sarah. I gave
